

5DME Airfield Visits Policy

Basic Overview

1. All visits to airfields where 5dme will be represented must be organised and approved by the 5DME Team Leader.
2. The Team Leader will send an official request to the appropriate person for access on the required day.
3. Appropriate access passes or permission will be organised by the Team Leader.
4. All visits will be entered in the 5DME Logs for future reference.
5. 5DME crew must be aware of airfield safety issues and act accordingly.
6. Safety is paramount at all times, airside and landside.
7. Wearing of 5DME promotional clothing is only to be in association with official 5DME visits and not used at other times to gain access.
8. 5DME crew members are not to partake in any action that degrades the reputation of 5DME or gives people misgivings about us being on site.

Responsibility

1. All crew are responsible for their personal safety and enter airfields at their own risk.
2. 5DME will not be responsible for personal injury.
3. 5DME will not be responsible for damage of any kind.
4. It is recommended that all crew check that they have public liability insurance. Usually, this is covered by household insurance policies and may extend Australia-wide for hobbies. This is to cover any accidental damage.
5. Crew members should also watch fellow crew for safety related issues.
6. 5DME crew should read and be aware of all other 5DME policies.
